



## SPENCER. Frederick Henry High Street EARLS BARTON

Only the briefest of information is available on Frederick Henry Spencer of Earls Barton but he did purchase a twenty-five horsepower Guy box van which was painted brown and registered BD 3788 on 27th September 1919. Evidently this Guy was used to carry both goods and passengers and was duly licensed to do so.

Circa February 1921 BD 3788 passed to Messrs Perrin & Coles of Northampton (NN-PE2) who continued to use it for the carriage of passengers and in whose ownership it was reported as seating either twenty or twenty-five people.

There is nothing to indicate that Frederick Spencer ever bought a second bus.
