HINES. Samuel Augustus Cemetery Cottage HARDINGSTONE

Samuel Augustus Hines took delivery of a dark green and black Wolseley lorry on 3rd May 1920 when it was used as a public conveyance as well as for the carriage of freight. Registered BD 4468 it would appear that any passenger carrying work Hines may have undertaken occurred in 1920 as from February 1921 this machine was licensed as a goods vehicle only. There are no records in the Northampton Watch Committee Minutes to suggest Hines ever ran a local bus service and the Wolseley, which could have been ex-War Department, was last licensed in June 1922.
