DUNN. Raymond 6A New Street, LOWER WEEDON

Sometimes when researching histories of minor bus operators eighty or more years after their demise, one is left with odd smatterings of information none of which seem to tie together. One such operator in this category is R Dunn (or is it C Dunn?) of Lower Weedon.

Raymond Dunn of 6A New Street, Lower Weedon is reputed to have owned a Graham Bros. bus registered new in 1928 as RP 6303 but this seems doubtful. He did however acquire RP 8304 which was a G.M.C. with twenty-seat Grose body, probably soon after April 1938. This bus had been new to George Robinson of Rushden (NN-RO3) in January 1930. It is far from clear though whether it was used by Raymond Dunn as a bus or as a good vehicle.

The third item to confuse the situation is that the Traffic Commissioners granted a Short-Period Road Service Licence to a C Dunn of Lower Weedon to provide a bus service between Badby - Newnham - Everdon - Northampton between 10th and 17th January 1936 whilst United Counties' Road Staff were on strike.

In the absence of further information it is difficult to know if the above items are inter-related in any way.
