The advertisement shown above indicating that the Grafton company operated 5-cwt and 1-ton vans together with 3-ton lorries appeared regularly in the Northampton press during 1920.

However, for the Easter 1920 Towcester Races meetings the Grafton Transport Co intimated that it would be conveying passengers from the Company's garage in William Street to the Races departing at 8, 9 and 10 o'clock at a fare of 2/6d single. No mention

is made of the Grafton possessing a motor bus so, presumably, vans or lorries were kitted out with seats for the purpose. A facsimile of an advertisement appearing in the Northampton Daily Chronicle on 31st March and 1st April 1920 is reproduced alongside.
