



ATKINS. William Marshall Corby Transport Company The Nag's Head CORBY

William Marshall Atkins was the licensee of the Nag's Head at Corby and, in March 1920, applied to the Streets, Buildings and Sanitary Committee of Kettering Urban District Council for licences for both an omnibus and for a Frederick Boddington of Corby to drive the said vehicle.

No details of Atkins' service are quoted but it may be presumed that he ran between Corby and Kettering at this time and he acquired a 30 horsepower Daimler lorry which was registered XA 8145 on 28th February 1920. Atkins traded as the Corby Transport Company and the Daimler lorry, which was painted dark green, could also be fitted with a thirty-seat charabanc body.

In the early months of 1920 Atkins advertised his vehicle as being available for hire both as a lorry and a charabanc so, if he did provide a Corby to Kettering service it must have been on market days only. It is assumed the Daimler was operated for no more than a couple of years and then withdrawn.
